| Item | Disposal Method | Notes | |

| Aluminum Cans | Recycle | | |
| Automotive Fluids (oil, antifreeze, brake fluid, gasoline, etc.) | Bring to Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility (HHWCF) | Curbside pick-up is available for motor oil; check with your garbage service | |
| Batteries (all kinds) | Bring to HHWCF or to store that accepts/recycles them (locations listed at WasteDiversion.org) | Consider rechargeable batteries | |
| Cat Litter | Put in trash (even the "flushable" kind) | If you bag it, use biodegradable bags | |
| Chemicals, Chemical Products | Bring to HHWCF | | |
| Cigarette Butts, Matches | Put in trash | Be sure they are completely out and cold | |
| Cleaning/Disinfecting Products | Bring to HHWCF (even "biodegradable" products) | Do not flush down toilet | |
| Condoms, Contraceptives | Put in trash | Do not flush down toilet | |
| Dental Floss | Put in trash | Do not flush down toilet | |
| Diapers (disposable) | Put in trash (even the "flushable" kind) | Do not flush down toilet | |
| Disposable Wipes | Put in trash (even the "flushable" kind) | Do not flush down toilet | |
| Drugs, Medications, Pharmaceuticals | Put in collection bins at: Alamo Sheriff's Substation, 150 Alamo Plaza, Suite C; Clayton PD (6000 Heritage Tr.); Concord PD (1350 Galindo St.); Danville PD (510 La Gonda Way); Martinez PD (525 Henrietta St.); Moraga PD (329 Rheem Blvd.); Orinda PD (22 Orinda Way); Pleasant Hill PD (330 Civic Dr.); San Ramon PD (2401 Crow Cyn Rd.); Sheriff's Station in Martinez (1980 Muir Rd.); Sheriff's Substation in Contra Costa Reg. Med. Center (2500 Alhambra Ave., Martinez); Walnut Creek City Hall, 1666 N. Main St. | Never flush, pour down the drain, or put in recycle cart Transfer drugs to sealable plastic bag before putting in collection bin | |
| E-Waste (computers, cell phones, TVs, etc.) | Take to: Contra Costa Transfer & Recovery Station. For more options: 1-800-750-4096; Earth911.org; CCCRecycle.org. | Some communities offer biannual curbside collection of e-waste; check with your garbage service | |
| Feminine Hygiene Products | Put in trash | Do not flush down toilet | |
| Food Waste | Put small amounts in garbage disposal (except for bones, egg shells, fats, oils, grease); or put in trash | Can be used in compost; (Lamorinda and Walnut Creek: put in green waste cart) | |
| Light BulbsFluorescent, including CFLs (Compact Fluorescent Lights) | Bring to HHWCF (Contain minute traces of mercury) | Check with local hardware stores for more convenient drop-off locations | |
| Light Bulbs—Filament, Halogen, LED | Put in trash | | |
| Mercury Thermometers, Thermostats and other Mercury-Containing Items | Bring to HHWCF | Exchange mercury fever thermometers for free digital ones at HHWCF | |
| Needles, Syringes, "Sharps" | Put in sharps disposal containers & take to: Alamo Sheriff's Substation, 150 Alamo Plaza, Suite C; Clayton PD, 6000 Heritage Tr.; Concord Disposal Service, 4080 Mallard Dr.; Danville PD, 510 La Gonda Way; Lafayette Fire Station, 338 Mt. Diablo Blvd; Moraga Fire Station, 1280 Moraga Way; Mt. View San. Dist., 3800 Arthur Rd., Martinez; Orinda PD, 22 Orinda Way; San Ramon Fire Dist., 1500 Bollinger Cyn Rd.; Rossmoor-Gateway Bldg., 1001 Golden Rain Rd.; Walnut Creek City Hall, 1666 N. Main St.; Walnut Creek Fire Station, 1050 Walnut Ave; use mail-back options listed at Stericycle.com (1-866-STERICALL) | Do not put in trash or recycle cart | |

| Item | Disposal Method | Notes | |

| Newspaper, Paper Products, Cardboard | Recycle | 100% pure paper products can be composted | |
| Oil, Grease, Fats (from food products) | Put in sealable container; feeze to solidify or mix with absorbent material (such as cat litter); put in trash | Bring large amounts (such as from turkey fryer) to HHWCF | |
| Paint (latex, oil-based), Stains, Thinners, Turpentine, Solvents, Varnish/Lacquer, Wood Preservatives, Epoxy | Bring to HHWCF; empty, dried-out containers may be put in trash | | |
| Personal Care Products (hair color, cosmetics, etc.) | Bring to HHWCF or put in trash | | |
| Pesticides, Fertilizers, Weed Killers | Bring to HHWCF | If using reusable sprayer, pour rinse water on ground, not down drain; consider alternatives to toxic products | |
| Pet Waste | Put in trash (consider biodegradable bags) | Do not flush; cat waste may contain parasites harmful to aquatic life and difficult for treatment processes to remove | |
| Plastic Bags | Take back to store or put in trash | Do not put in recycle bin | |
| Plastic Bottles | Recycle | | |
| Styrofoam | Put in trash | Call 1-877-918- 8900 to recycle large quantities | |
| Tires | Return to tire dealer | Fees may apply | |
| Wood (treated) | Bring to Recology Hay Rd. Landfill, (707) 678-4718; or Altamont Pass Landfill, (925) 455-7300 | Fees and special instructions apply | |
| Yard Waste | Put in green waste cart; or take to Acme Landfill, Contra Costa Transfer & Recovery Station, or Walnut Creek Recycling Center | Can be composted; fees may apply | |
