Best Management Practices

Staff at this Dental Practice have read and follow all these CCCSD Dental Mercury Best Management Practices (BMPs):

1. Use, when appropriate, mercury-free alternatives to amalgam.
2. Store scrap amalgam waste in a designated, air-tight container for disposal by the appropriate agency or recycler.
3. Clean or replace chair-side amalgam traps and/or screens regularly.
4. Clean or replace central vacuum filters or traps regularly.
5. Use a line cleanser or disinfectant that will not solubilize mercury retained in the plumbing system (e.g. no chlorine compounds).
6. Use predisposed encapsulated amalgam; discontinue use of bulk mercury and bulk alloy.
7. Use only appropriately trained personnel to clean up a mercury spill. Never clean up a mercury spill with a commercial vacuum cleaner.
8. Install and properly maintain an ISO-certified amalgam separator.
