

Environmental Compliance Section Special Discharge Permit – General Information

This Guide is for Industrial Users (IUs) and contractors planning to discharge wastewater to Central San's sewer system in Central San's service area. It is intended to serve as a general overview of the requirements and permit fees.

A Special Discharge Permit (SDP) is a short term wastewater discharge permit. The length of the permit ranges from a week up to one year. It is issued for the operation and monitoring of specified wastewater discharges into Central San's sanitary sewer system.

To facilitate the permit review process and for the Environmental Compliance Section to properly evaluate and process a Special Discharge Permit application, it is necessary that the applicant provide a complete and accurate permit application. The guidelines that follow provide information that must be included in the application submittal.

The processing time for a Special Discharge Permit is approximately two weeks from the date the application is received and after the fees are paid.

(additional time will be required if requesting greater than 50-gpm flow rate)

Projects that may need a Special Discharge Permit include:

- Underground storage tank or gas station remediation.
- Water line or pipeline hydrostatic testing.
- Groundwater or stormwater remediation from expected contaminated sites.
- Dewatering from a construction site.

To apply for a Special Discharge Permit, applicants must submit the following:

- Completed Special Discharge Permit Application form.
- Full payment of applicable fees.
- Analytical results of representative discharge sample(s), if required.
- Supporting documentation as required (i.e., Schematic & Pretreatment Plans, other documents as applicable).

Permit Fees can be paid by check or via PayPal. Check with Environmental Compliance Section for total fees.


